Dear Majority Leader Reid and Minority Leader McConnell:

America's transportation system is a matter of vital national importance, playing a critical role in our economic competitiveness and growth over the last fifty years. Yet our nation lacks a clearly articulated transportation vision to guide our future infrastructure investments. The current fiscal environment makes it more important than ever to spend transportation dollars in a manner that is both accountable and transparent.

For these reasons, we ask you to support the *National Surface Transportation and Freight Policy Act* (Title XII of S. 1950) as you consider the upcoming surface transportation authorization bill on the floor of the U.S. Senate. This legislation will help ensure we take the critical steps necessary to develop a performance-driven national transportation program. It will ensure a comprehensive national strategy for breaking gridlock, reducing fatality rates, reducing our dependence on foreign oil, and efficiently moving goods and people while improving access, quality of life, and public health.

For the first time in more than twenty years the surface transportation authorization bill being considered in Congress does not significantly increase transportation investments. Establishing a national vision and performance measures will help ensure that we are making the most of our limited transportation funds. We applaud the steps that have been taken by the Senate Environment and Public Works Committee and the Senate Banking Committee to establish performance measures for the highway and transit programs respectively. The measures included in the *National Surface Transportation and Freight Policy Act* will help ensure we have overarching goals and objectives for our nation's multimodal transportation system.

This Act also includes key provisions to improve the nation's transportation system. It would help ensure that new transportation facilities built with federal funds will safely accommodate all users. This will help reduce traffic-related fatalities on our roadways, which totaled more than 411,000 over the last decade. The Act would also establish a multimodal grant program to help improve goods movement, which would award grants to projects using a merit-based process that considers mobility, innovation, environment and public health.

We hope that you will support the development of national transportation goals and objectives to ensure we are working to meet a national vision for our transportation system in addition to other important provisions in the National Surface Transportation and Freight Policy Act. Thank you for your consideration.
