Technology has transformed the way we do business, receive healthcare, and communicate with our loved ones, yet close to 1 in 5 Americans do not use the Internet.


Disproportionately from low-income and minority communities, these populations remain isolated from our digital society.

The ConnectHome pilot program is launching in **twenty-seven cities and one tribal nation**. It aims to reach nearly 200,000 children living in public housing with the support they need to access the Internet at home.



### WHICH KINDS OF HOUSING PROVIDERS ARE ELIGIBLE?


Public housing Authorities, privately owned/multi-family housing developers, and Section8 Housing Providers are eligible and encouraged to apply.




# WILL CONNECTHOME NATION ACCEPT MULTIPLE APPLICATIONS FROM ONE GEOGRAPHY?

ConnectHome Nation will only accept **one application per geography**, however, if groups want to form a coalition to work together and apply as one, this is permissible.





# CAN I APPLY FOR MORE THAN ONE GEGRAPHY?



Counties, states, and housing providers that cover more than one geography may apply, however they must meet all application requirements for each geography.

Examples: State/County applicants need a commitment letter from governor/county manager.

Housing providers need a letter from each geography in which they plan to implement.
